<p>Application process & payment of clinic fees</p>	<p>Applications will open on 10th December 2022 at 8am. Applications received before this time & date will not be valid.</p> <p>This application form must be sent via email to the host for your location. Positions will be given on a “first in first served” basis.</p> <p>Once it has been confirmed that you have a position, a PayPal invoice will be sent to you via email from hoofbuilders@outlook.com.</p> <p>Please check your junk/spam folder if you cannot find the invoice. The invoice can be paid with a PayPal account or with a credit or debit card. If you are having trouble, please contact your host. The deposit (50% of fees) is due within 24 hours to secure your place in the clinic.</p> <p>Remaining fees are due one month before the clinic (or one month before the first clinic of international tours). We reserve the right to advertise positions to persons on the waiting list should anybody not make full payment by the due dates.</p>
<p>Schedule</p>	<p>Start time is 9am both days - please arrive with enough time to be ready to start at 9am. Finishing time will vary, but is usually around 5pm. A more detailed clinic planner will be sent out by your host closer to the clinic. We have the clinic planner for the sake of organisation, but please know that David is not one to stick to strict timelines. Be prepared to be flexible with the proceedings each day, and allow yourself to go with the flow.</p>
<p>Tools</p>	<p>Participants - please bring your trimming tools including sharpening equipment. Minimum tools required are a pair of nippers, a loop knife (or preferred knives), a rasp (preferably new) & a hoof pick. Feel free to bring any other tools that you use, stands, gloves, aprons etc. Power tools welcome, cordless preferred.</p> <p>Auditors - please bring a loop knife & sharpening equipment if you would like to participate in the tool sharpening session after lunch each day.</p>
<p>Questions & Expectations</p>	<p>During the clinic we encourage all participants and auditors to ask questions. There is no such thing as a silly question. If you need something clarified or repeated, please let David know. We expect all participants & auditors to be patient and kind to the horses & to each other. Please allow space for everyone to have a voice.</p>

<p>Format</p> <p><i>(A detailed description written by David)</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ I trim 2-3 horses in the morning on each day. For the first horse participants are asked to watch my trimming and watch for the horse's feedback closely, but to hold questions or comments until after the trimming is done. ■ For the second and third horses participants are encouraged to watch and ask questions at anytime during the trim. ■ There are 4 participant horses in the afternoon on each day, so each owner will work with another participant in a team and have 3-4 hours to trim under my supervision. ■ I go from horse to horse. They are all in different areas in the same arena, or round pen, so I'm never very far away. Team members can work with their horses tied loosely, request someone hold their horse on a lead, or try trimming at liberty. They can change their mind at any time. ■ Team members have to talk with each other about what they think needs to be accomplished and agree on trim decisions before any trimming is done. If they can't reach an agreement then I will help. The owner of the horse has the final say. We do it this way to model how a healthy owner/farrier/vet relationship should function and to give horse owners practice without pressure on how to advocate for their horse. ■ There are unlimited time outs and I encourage trimming more conservatively so I have a little retained dead stuff to work with when I make the final adjustments. There is no difference between my clinic trim and my at home trim. I take responsibility for all the trims and I want all the horses to feel better when they leave than they did when they came in.
<p>Acknowledgement of risk</p>	<p>By submitting this application and paying the clinic fees, you acknowledge that interacting with horses carries an inherent risk, and David and his team will not be held responsible for any injuries to participants or horses. We expect all participants and auditors to be responsible for their own safety throughout the clinic, and not put anyone in danger.</p>
<p>Photos & Videos</p>	<p>Participants and auditors are welcome to take still photographs throughout the clinic, and retain them for personal use. We request that there is no videoing by participants or auditors throughout the clinic.</p> <p>Participants and auditors acknowledge that they may appear in photos or videos taken by David or his team, which may be used for commercial purposes in future. Please make David aware at the beginning of the clinic if you do not wish to be in any photographs or videos.</p>

Cancellations	<p>If you are unable to attend for any reason you may ask the host to offer your place to the next person on the waiting list, and they will be responsible for buying your position in the clinic directly from you.</p> <p>If there is no waiting list for your location, you will be responsible for finding someone to buy your position.</p> <p>If you are unable to attend the clinic due to extenuating circumstances (eg. illness), a full refund, minus a 10% administration fee, will be issued for clinics which are at minimum capacity (at least 10 other participants).</p> <p>If the clinic is canceled due to circumstances outside of the organisers' control (eg. large scale weather event), a full refund will be issued to all participants and auditors, minus a 10% administration fee.</p>
